Message from the Chief Patron



Dear Esteemed Colleagues, Partners, and Delegates,

It is with immense pride and purpose that I welcome you to **ITACC 2.0 — the International Conference on Trauma & Acute Care**, a national and global platform positioned at the intersection of **clinical science, public health, road safety, and emergency preparedness**.

India stands at a critical inflection point in its mission to reshape the future of **road safety, emergency response, and trauma care**. The scale of the challenge before us is both undeniable and urgent.

As per the **Ministry of Road Transport & Highways**, India recorded **4,80,583 road accidents and 1,72,890 deaths in 2023, the highest fatality count ever reported**, reflecting a **2.6% increase over 2022**. Provisional national data for **2024 indicates approximately 1.77 lakh fatalities, averaging 485 deaths per day**, underlining that the crisis continues unabated.

At the global level, the **World Health Organization reports 1.19 million road-crash deaths annually**, with **India contributing approximately 10–11% of worldwide fatalities**, despite having only about **1% of the world's vehicles**. Alarmingly, **road traffic injuries remain the leading cause of death among people aged 5–29 years globally**, striking at the heart of our most economically productive population.

Behind every statistic is a family altered forever, emotionally, socially, and financially, by a loss that is often **sudden, preventable, and systemic**. This is not only a clinical challenge; **it is a national and societal responsibility**.

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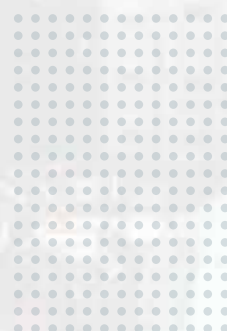
